coins!


"Oh! We found a bag of go

Emma quickly replied, "We? I was the one who found it. You were busy looking at the birds. These coins are mine."



He often heard people telling stories. Some spoke wisely, while others said things that were not true—like a woman


claiming an elephant jumped over a fence, or a man boasting that he had


This sight made the sad king laugh out loud. Delighted, the king rewarded Simpleton by letting him marry the princess,


On her journey, Dorothy met many dangers but also made new friends: a Scarecrow,

But suddenly, she trips.


The pail falls. The milk is gone.

He gave the raincoat—and a ride—to his friend, and off they went.




Kit's Shoes


"Oh!" the monkey exclaimed, "you should have told me earlier. I left my heart on the tree."



That day, he learned something important:




THE FISHERMAN AND THE FISH

"This is a magic pot.


It will cook porridge

The Lost Hat


