

Honey Drops

Explain to children, when a vowel is followed by an 'r' the 'r' changes the way the vowel sounds. The vowel is called an 'r-controlled vowel'. This 'R' is called the 'Bossy R' because it controls or simply 'bosses' the vowel to produce a new sound.

Explain - we use both 'oi' and 'oy' to make the /oi/ sound. Ask them to think of words 'boy' and 'foil'. When that sound comes in the middle of a word, we use 'oi'. If it comes at the end of the word, we will use 'oy'.


