

Tips for Reading Together

Children learn best when reading is fun.

- Talk about the title and the pictures on the cover.
- Look through the pictures together and discuss what you think the story might be about.
- Read the story together, pointing to the words and inviting your child to join in.
- Give lots of praise as your child reads with you, and help them when necessary.
- Have fun finding the hidden cats.
- Enjoy re-reading the story and encourage your child to say the repeated phrases with you.

Children enjoy reading stories again and again.

This helps to build their confidence.













"Look at Dad," said Mum.



"Dad looks silly," said Wilma.



Dad put on a red nose.





A maze







Who is Super Dad?






For children who:


- can recognise a few words by sight

- know some initial letter sounds














Oxford Reading Tree is used in 80% of primary schools
