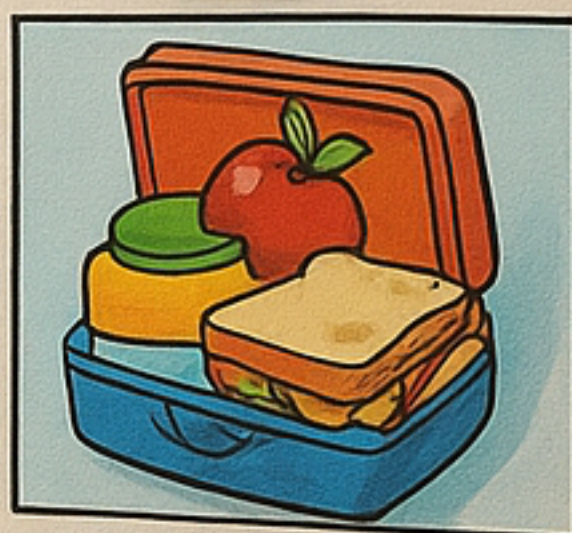

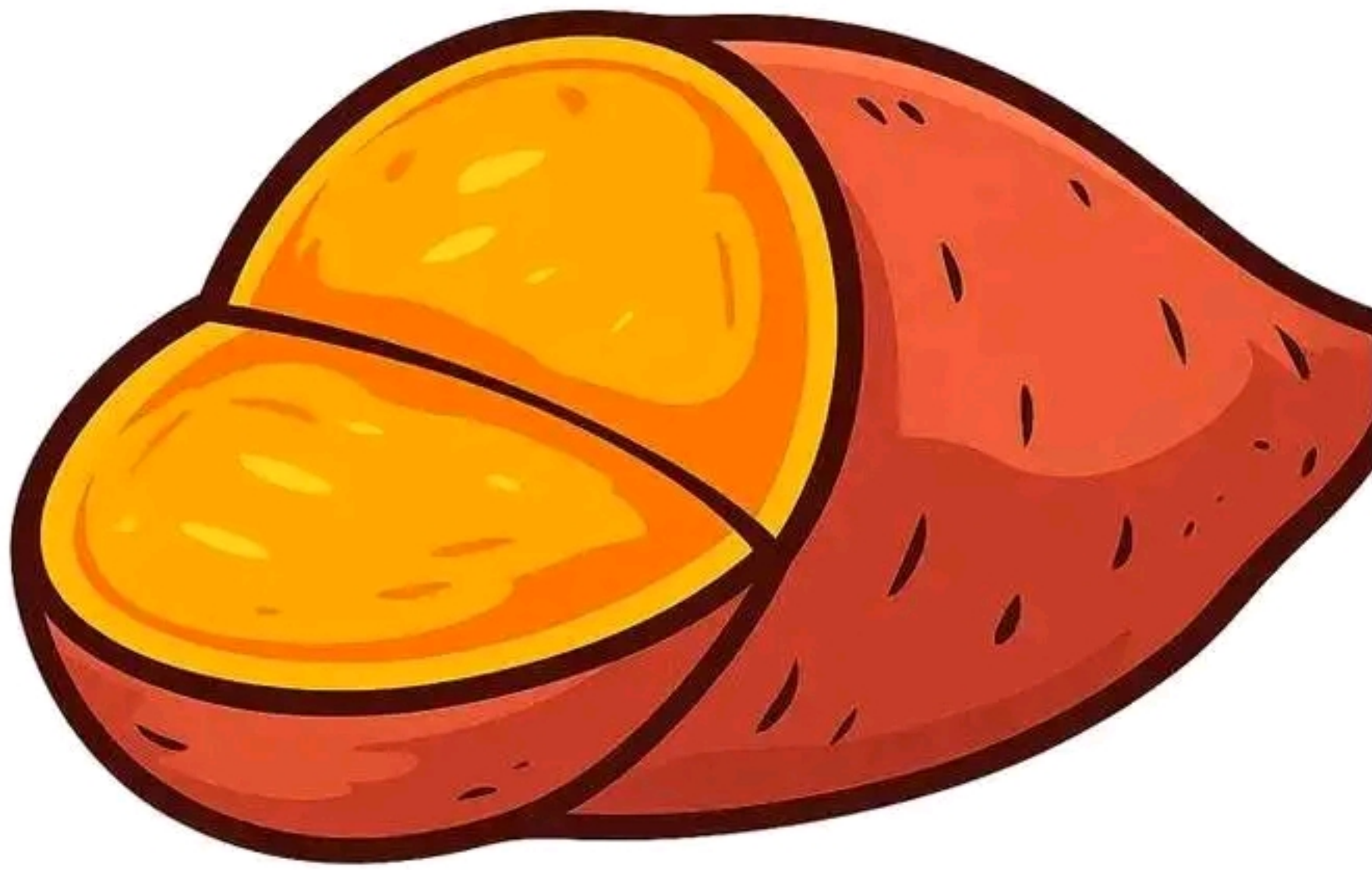

Moral: Perseverance transforms challenges into achievements.

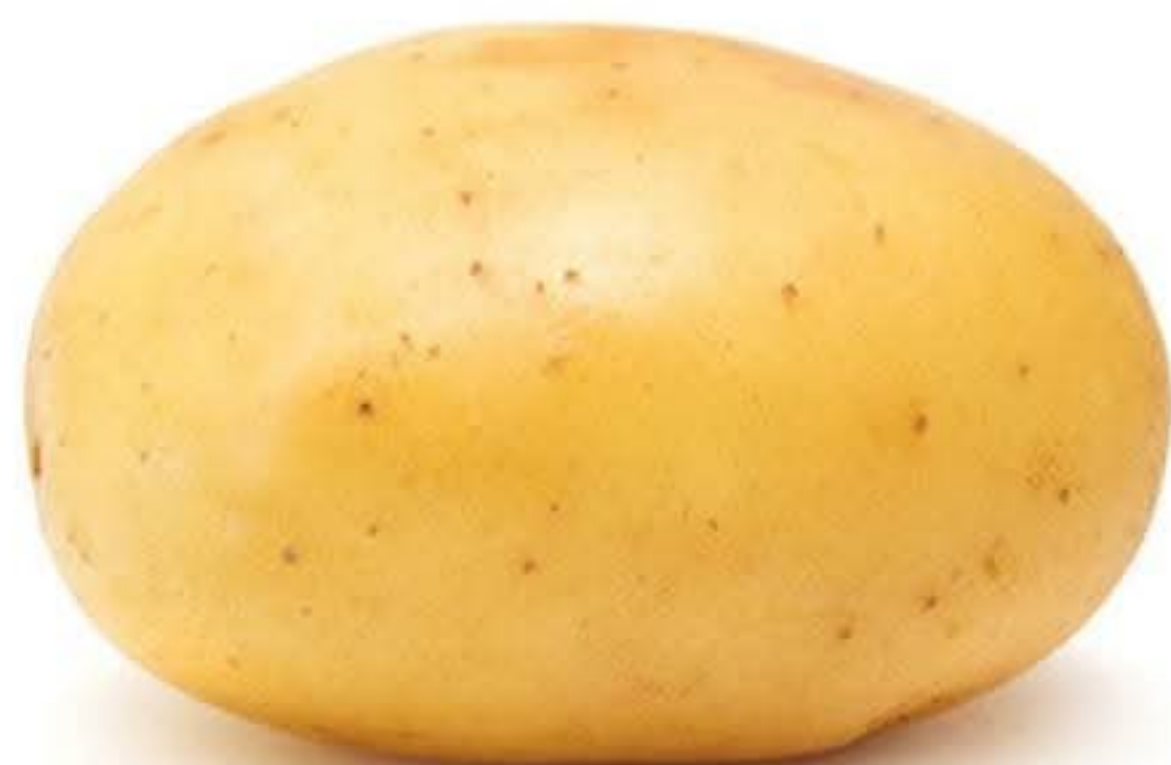

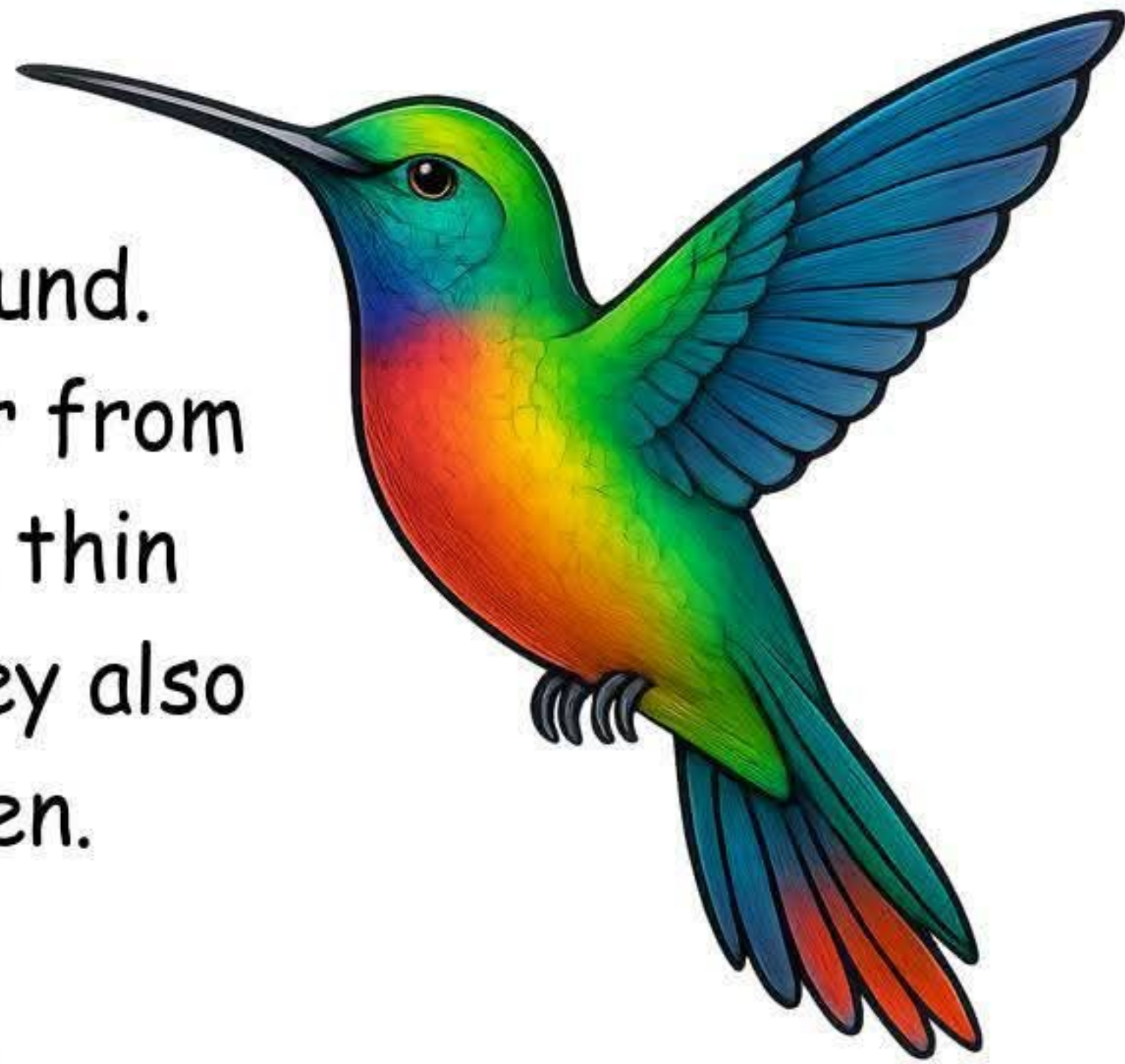

Hummingbirds

Hummingbirds are tiny birds with colorful feathers that shine like jewels. They are the only birds that can fly backward! Their wings beat so fast that they make a humming sound.
